In a fire evacuation, never open doors that are warm to the touch. If you must escape through the smoke, get low and crawl under the smoke to the exit. Close the doors behind you. If smoke, heat, or flames block your exit routes, stay in your unit and put as many closed doors as possible between you and the fire. Call 9-1-1.

Recycling Comingled Materials Tip: Montgomery County requires us to recycle comingled materials (bottles, jars, cans and containers). There are recycling bins next to the trash chutes on each floor. Place all commingled materials in the open blue bin.


Before you place your bottles, jars, cans, and containers in the bin, be sure that they are emptied and rinsed and no food residue is left inside. The types of commingled materials that can be recycled include:

- · Aluminum cans and foil products
- · Bi-metal (steel/tin) cans (leave lids on if possible)
- · Empty, non-hazardous aerosol cans
- · Glass bottles and jars (be sure and remove the metal or plastic lid and recycle separately)
- · Plastic bottles, containers, tubs, lids, pails, buckets and flower pots
