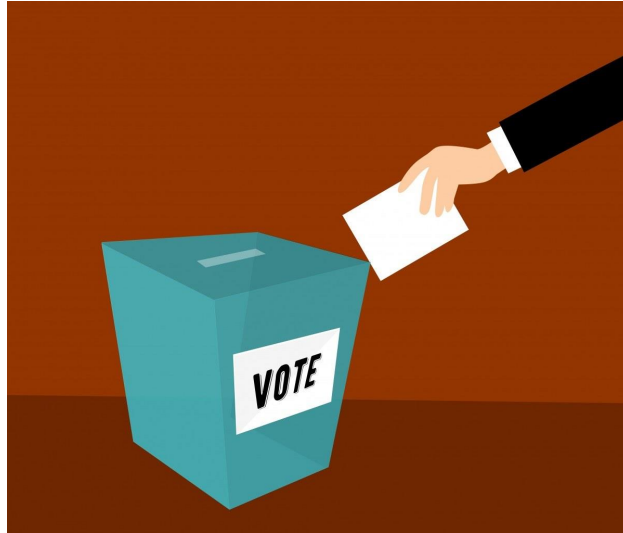


4620 News Roundup

Voting



Two elections are currently in progress, one to choose board members to fill four seats, and another to approve the Special Assessment necessary to fund the buildingwide HVAC replacement. Each unit with an email on file receives an email from 4620northparkcondo@ivotehoa.com with a link to the voting site and a registration code. If a unit has more than one owner, only one owner will receive the email, usually the one who is first alphabetically. To find the email, search your inbox for 4620northparkcondo@ivotehoa.com. If you don't see it there, check your junk/spam folders. If you still don't find it, email assistantmanager@4620northparkcondo.com for assistance.

If you prefer to vote by paper, there are paper ballots at the front desk.

The Special Assessment vote closes Monday, May 19th, at 7:30 pm.

The Board of Directors vote closes Wednesday, May 21st, at 7:30 pm.

Quorum is 51 percent. We have surpassed quorum on the Board of Directors vote, with 69 percent of the membership having voted. We are still trying to reach quorum for the Special Assessment vote. We are at 45 percent right now.

SAFETY AND UPKEEP TIP

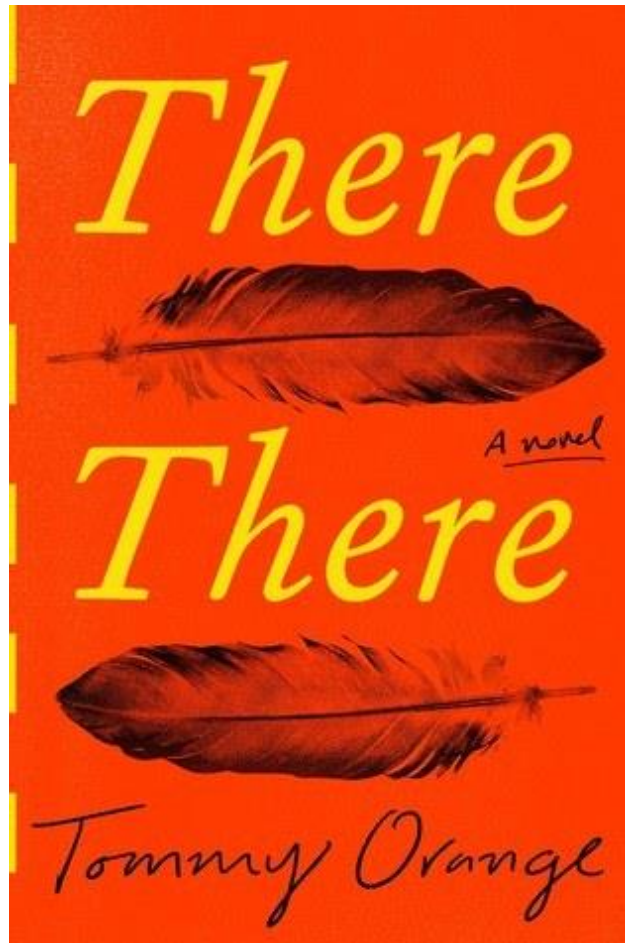
